## *From the President*

#### **Good News....there WILL be a WØDXCC Convention.**

The First WØDXCC Convention will be held in Omaha NE on **Saturday, September 28, 2002**, assuming, of course, that **you all** are willing to help.

I need the cooperation from each of the DX Clubs: The KCDX Association, the Heartland DXA, the Twin Cities DXC, the EIDXA, the Mississippi Valley DXA, the Mile High DXA and the MMM . Please advise ASAP that you support the Convention so that I can include your club name as a sponsor. (It won't cost you anything, I'm personally taking the risk.) However, if you are not willing to lend your name as a sponsor and help get your members to attend let me know. I must have your club's pledge that you are behind this project.

Time is of the essence. I would like to sign the Contract with the Holiday Inn Convention Center on Monday. I am a little concerned because I have only heard from 3 DX Clubs...and we really need all of the clubs to get behind this project. Please let me know your positions ASAP.

I have contacted Chuck at Tenedyne and he has agreed to put on a forum on log periodics, yagi and monobanders and will donate a log periodic as a grand prize. Vendors are also interested. Burghardt Amateur Radio will come and sponsor a "transceiver shoot out" pitting all of the new HF rigs against each other for you to decide which is best for you, etc. TI9M will come and tell us about the recent trip to Cocos Is. and will have the TI9M cards with him. (We have respectfully turned down an offer of fake Scarborough and P5 cards and have referred them instead to the W9DXCC convention to be held the prior week. <G> [that ought to rile the W9 boys] )

**The Mr. DX Award... chosen by the Presidents of each of the sponsoring zero land DX associations.**

At the convention banquet, you will be giving the Mr. DX Award to the Amateur who best exemplifies the art of DX. I will send nomination forms for Mr. or Ms Dx to

each of your club members (provided you get me a list with their name and address) as well as to every W0 who upgraded their DXCC status last year. This should be a pool of approximately 500. Any one in zero land can make a nomination. The nomination form is attached to this e-mail as an Adobe .pdf file. If you can't open a .pdf file, log on to [www.adobe.com](http://www.adobe.com) and download and install adobe reader.

As soon as possible after the September 12, 2002 nomination deadline, I will mail a copy of all of the nomination papers to each club president. After you have had time to study them and make your individual picks, I will arrange for a teleconference call with all of the presidents and you can choose the lucky winner.

**The Venue Committee: Next years convention venue to be chosen by the Vice-Presidents of the sponsoring zero land DX clubs.**

At the convention, the vice presidents of the sponsoring zero land Dx clubs will meet and chose the venue for the next years Convention. Consequently it is imperative that you and your vice-presidents be in attendance.

So:

1. Please e-mail me **asap** if you and your club are behind the Convention.
2. Please e-mail me the name and address (and hopefully e-mail addresses) of each of your club members so that I can contact them directly.
3. Please give me your best estimate of the number of members from your club that you believe will attend the convention in Omaha. This is important because we

have to have some idea as to the number of people who will attend.

4. If you run a list serve as part of your club, please post an e-mail about the WØ DXCC Convention in Omaha, NE and ask everyone to e-mail me at k0pcg@CritelliLaw.com and let me know if they think it is a good idea and their ideas for speakers/forums etc. and whether they will be willing to come to the convention.

5. Lastly, many thanks to the KCDXC Lee and the Heartland DXA, Todd for their input and work. Todd is working on a web page that will be up shortly.

## ***A New Concept in Maps***

People might be interested to see a new type of Ham Map, now available for free on my website. It will be of use to all amateurs, whether HF or VHF based.

The problem with ordinary web-based maps is that there is either too little or too much information on the screen. I have just completed a map of Europe, the first in a series of Overlay Maps, where YOU get to choose the amount of information you have on display.

The following overlays are available:  
Country Outlines, CQ Zones, ITU Zones, Time Zones, Grid Locators, Country Names, Capital Cities, Prefixes, Flags.

You can chose which overlays are on display, the order they are displayed, and which one is on the top. The map can be saved in the normal manner (File>Save As) for viewing off-line, and it can be printed out with what ever overlays are active.

As the page is graphics-intensive (220kB) it takes approximately 30seconds to load with a 56kB modem, or 1 minute with a 28.2Kb modem. A pre-loader page is provided as an entry point. The address is:

Or it can be accessed through the normal menu on my website.

**IMPORTANT: THE MAP REQUIRES JAVASCRIPT TO BE ENABLED ON YOUR BROWSER. IF YOU HAVE JAVASCRIPT TURNED OFF, IT WON'T WORK.**

I welcome any comments or suggestions for other maps.
