We will use the data from the ARRL DXCC Standings website (<u>http://www.arrl.org/dxcc-standings</u>), as of 01 July as our basis. If your DXCC status is up-to-date on this league website, no additional action is warranted.

If you have other data such as DXCC totals that have not been submitted to the league, totals for 60m (not tracked by league), or DXCC totals less than the threshold for league publication, you may submit them to us for inclusion in the club website.

(Watch the email reflector for an excel template - Ed.) The preferred method of submitting your data to us, is by using the Excel template on the club website www.eidxa.org. Please select "\_\_\_\_\_\_ ...", and follow instructions for downloading the Excel template. Then fill in the blanks, save, and E-mail the completed template to me (Gary at my QRZ email).

But other methods of submittal such as simple text E-mails, screen captures from LoTW, or from your own logging software are acceptable.

You may also provide paper copies of your inputs at the July club meeting.

Please respond by the club meeting on 11 July 2025 to be

included in this update.

When compiled, the club members' DXCC standings will be published on the club website.
